Extra-curricular sports

In an effort to slow the rising transmission of COVID-19 in our communities, the current public health orders will be changing. Starting on **December 6**th, all students who are eligible to be vaccinated must provide **proof of vaccination to participate in indoor extra-curricular sports** or show proof of a recent negative rapid antigen test (test to be provided/obtained by the student). Students with **one dose will be permitted** to participate without testing.

School based PE classes

Students will not require proof of vaccination to participate in physical education, as this is part of the school curriculum. The public health orders apply to permits issued for community use of schools.

Joint message from Public Health and Manitoba Education

Here are several key messages in response to inquires.

- Since school cases are impacted by trends in the school's surrounding community, it is not unexpected to see cases in schools when community cases rise. Public health and Manitoba Education are working with divisions and schools to keep students in schools as much as possible but preparedness plans are in place to ensure safety of staff and students is prioritized.
- The school case definition was updated this year to be more specific and aligned with the incubation period for COVID-19, which is **14 days**. A school case does **not** mean there was acquisition or transmission at the school, but allows public health to monitor overall cases that may be associated with a school. For an outbreak to be called, the outbreak definition needs to be met including evidence of inschool transmission.
- The change for the definition of an outbreak is more precise in response to the growing understanding of COVID-19 transmission. The definition allows public health to act immediately and with precision, directing classrooms and cohorts to remote learning, rather than entire schools unless needed as well as working with schools to review, assess and implement additional preventative measures.
- We know the vaccination status of others is the best protection against COVID-19 for unvaccinated students who are not eligible. This means we want all eligible school staff and students to get immunized for COVID-19 as soon as possible to give our students the best chance to keep learning and stay safe.
- We also want parents of youth aged five to 11 to be ready once the COVID-19 vaccines are approved for
 these young people. Manitoba is actively planning to ensure that these vaccinations take place as quickly
 as possible after approval. More information will be shared with the public in the coming weeks.
