Grade 9-12 dual track school with an enrolment of approx. 400 students. We returned to our 2-semester system this year as COVID restrictions opened up.

We have 27.5 FTE teaching staff which includes 2 administrators, 2 counselors and 2 resource teachers; plus 13 support staff (3 office staff, 1 librarian, and 9 Education Assistants).

MBCI offers academic and vocational programs for students. Students receive their vocational training through an ongoing partnership in the Pre-Employment program with UCN.
